Associate in Arts to Bachelor of Arts in Elementary Education

Guide updated June 2024 pending Augustana approval

This guide between Black Hawk College (BHC) and Augustana College (Augustana) is intended to create a smooth and seamless curriculum transition for students who earn the Associate in Arts (AA) degree at BHC to transfer and complete the Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree in Elementary Education at Augustana in an additional two years plus a student teaching term. This guide incorporates the 2024-2025 BHC and Augustana catalogs.

Degree Availability	AA offered on the Quad Cities and East Campuses and online. Science labs on campus only. SPAN courses at QC Campus only. BA in Elementary Education offered on campus.
GPA Requirements	 Graduation from BHC 2.00 Admission to Augustana based on overall academic strength. To be competitive for admission a minimum transferrable GPA of 2.5 is preferred. Students also must have completed at least one semester of college level coursework. Admission to the Elementary Education major 2.75 Students with a GPA in the 2.50-2.74 range shall also be considered for provisional admission. Early contact with the Augustana Education Department is encouraged.
Grade Requirements	Augustana will grant transfer credit for college-level work in all areas that correspond to courses offered at Augustana, and that were completed with a grade of "C" or better.
General Education	 Refer to the <u>BHC AA degree requirements</u> or your student Degree Audit for IAI General Education Core Curriculum (GECC) course options. Also view the <u>Augustana General Education Requirements</u>. Your advisor can assist. The AA degree includes the IAI General Education Core Curriculum, and satisfies Augustana's Learning Perspectives. BHC requires one non-western studies course for graduation and it may simultaneously fulfill an IAI category in Humanities, Fine Arts, or Social and Behavioral Sciences, or be taken as an elective in the AA degree. Students must also meet Augustana's requirements in Writing, Second Language, Reasoned Examination of Faith (REF), Physical Education activities, Transfer Transitions course (LSC 300) and the Suffix requirements in Quantitative Reasoning (Q), Global Diversity (G) and Multicultural Diversity (D). Augustana's second language requirement for graduation can be met by 1) completion of four years of a single second language in high school, 2) satisfactory performance on a competency test at Augustana, 3) completion of a 102-level course in a foreign
Credit Hours	language at Augustana, or 4) the equivalent of one year of a foreign language in college (SPAN 101 and SPAN 102 at BHC). BHC credits on this guide: 62-63
	 Augustana credits on this guide: 62-03 Augustana credits on this guide: 64-72, plus 8 optional credits in January terms. A minimum of 60 credits is required to complete the AA degree. A minimum of 60 credits must be earned at Augustana. A minimum of 124 from BHC and Augustana are required to complete the BA in Elementary Education.

✓ A maximum of 60 community college credits may be applied toward the minimum 124 credits required for a bachelor degree at Augustana.

Education Major Extended Credit Program

To meet state licensure standards, Augustana students pursuing a major in an education field are eligible to participate in an annual extended credit program. All Augustana students are allowed to take up to 34 credits each academic year under the Augustana tuition plan. Students who enroll in an education major are allowed to enroll in an additional four credits per year (38 total).
